2. What does the subplot carried on by Dunstan and Godfrey add to the overall novel? What does it take away from the novel? (*Once again, imagine how the story would be different if the subplot were taken out to help you realize why the author had to include it.*)

3. How would you react if you had been a villager when Silas started caring for Eppie? Explain your actions and reactions.

4. One theme (message, main point) of this novel is consequences. Explain how this theme is woven throughout the story. (*Your explanation should include at least 3 specific events that show consequences for someone's choices, and a description of what the author wants you to learn about consequences.*) Use the back of the page for this answer---I expect you to need at least 2 paragraphs to answer.
